

Career Technical Education (CTE) offers a strong academic and technical education to prepare students for both college and career. Locally, Heights Career Tech offers courses through a five-district consortium, which includes Bedford, Cleveland Heights, Maple Heights, Shaker Heights, and Warrensville Heights High Schools.

- As a CTE student, your home school will remain your home school.
- Students continue to participate in their home school activities, clubs, athletics, etc.
- Students take classes (core subjects) at their home school for half of the school day.
- Students spend the other half of their school day at the site of their CTE program.
- Typically, juniors spend the morning at their CTE programs and take their core subjects in the afternoon at their home school, while seniors CTE programs are in the afternoon.
- Transportation is provided to and from all CTE school sites.
- Most programs require a two year commitment.

Applications are accepted in the fall of the current school year for sophomore students. Deadlines are posted on the website.

Key Factors in the Admissions Process:

- Credits earned towards graduation
- Overall school performance including attendance and behavior
- Interview (timeline TBD)
- Timely submission of application
- Thoughtful answers to extended response questions

- Officially accept your admission into the program.
- Communicate with your school counselor about your decision and class schedule.
